3. Do you support the proposed location of the road crossing on the Kiewa Valley Highway (outside the Old Tawonga Store)?

The Alpine Shire continue to tell the community that the road crossing should be directly in front of the Old Tawonga Store.

But did you know that the crossing results in the loss of car parks on both sides of the highway in front of the Store.

We are suggesting a site between the Store and the (new) Pioneer Park car park entrance.

On-site car parking should be in ABP Stage 1A not Stage 3, delivered with the other Stage 1A improvements focused on improved circulation and safety for pedestrians

TDCA view on key elements of the Alpine Shire adopted concept plan

Council has asked the following questions seeking your feedback on four key elements of the draft design:

- The proposed location of the road crossing on the Kiewa Valley Highway
- The proposed location of the pump track at the top of Pioneer Park, above the playground
- The proposed use of the Scout Hall site as open space
- The proposed location and amount of car parking at Pioneer Park

Tawonga and District Community Association (TDCA) believe there are missed opportunities to deliver on community expressed needs on each of the above four elements, as well as issues previously raised not yet answered:

- Township entry signage why do we need new?
- Extra tree planting less trees, more open space
- Garden beds bring maintenance issues

Funding for the ABP Tawonga project is not currently settled. It is likely to be sourced from Federal and/or State government grant(s) over several years.

Location of the road crossing on the Kiewa Valley Highway

Vote "NO"

Parking in front of the Old Tawonga Store is a major sticking point. Council has ignored the 171 people who signed a petition in 2021 asking that no car parking spaces be lost.

The Old Tawonga Store is both a retail café and it is the Tawonga Post Office. Community young, old, able and challenged must have convenient access with over 200 residents buying their supplies, a coffee and cake, or collecting their mail and parcels daily.

The 2021 census showed that retirees and the elderly made up the largest proportion of the Tawonga community and with no postal delivery service many of them expect to park in front or close to the store.

But parking can be a challenge. Already in front of the store is the reserved spot for the mail-truck. Passing trucks, buses, semi-trailers, caravans and visitors stopping to enter Pioneer Park via the entrance directly opposite the store to use public toilets compete for parking with locals.

The concept plan has kept the pedestrian outstands directly in front of the store, causing loss of car parks on both sides of the highway, making a bad situation worse.

The counter-proposal is that the pedestrian outstands and park entrance be moved north along the highway, returning car-parks in front of the store, whilst pulling traffic linked to toilet users away from the area in front of the store. This new location integrates with the school bus stops and includes covered seating. New park paths run up to the toilets and new on-site car parking. The current park entrance would be closed.

The proposed location of the pump track at the top of Pioneer Park, above the playground

Vote "YES"

TDCA welcome the inclusion of the pump track for young children adjacent to the upgraded playground. The missed opportunity is there is no adjacent shelter with covered seating for the carers of the children using the playground and/or pump track.

The feedback suggested to Council is to replace the stand-alone seat on the new circuit track (Page 2 of the Plan) with a shelter and seating (Shelter 3), in line with the styling proposed for the new or retrofitted shelters that will oversee the play court area (Shelter 2 and Shelter 1 respectively).

The proposed use of the Scout Hall site as open space

Vote "NO"

The TDCA and Kiewa Valley Historical Society jointly have proposed a new public display facility showcasing the history of the Tawonga area from the First Nations through to the more recent settlers with their history of dairying, the cattlemen, tobacco - all things rural. The display would provide locals and visitors an additional point of educational interest within the park, speaking to the town character.

The counter-proposal is that the Scout Hall site (and site above toilet block) should be green, open space for NOW until delivery of the new public display facility showcasing Tawonga history.

The proposed location and amount of car parking at Pioneer Park

Vote "YES"

On-site car parking in Pioneer Park is included in the concept plan which will provide easy and safe access to the playground, pump track, toilets, BBQ and shelters.

The Pioneer Park parking also provides replacement parking for Tawonga Memorial Hall users, across the highway, which is losing car parks as part of its upgrade, expected for completion in early 2023.

The trouble is that car-park is to be delivered in the "no date specified", final stage (Stage 3) of the ABP Tawonga project.

The feedback suggested to Council is that the carpark should not be a Stage 3 deliverable but a Stage 1A deliverable together with the other Stage 1A improvements that are focused on improved circulation and safety for pedestrians
